#### Service in the Big Easy

During March 2-8, 2013, while most of their colleagues over at Quincy University were departing to all points for a relax-

ing, lazy spring break, 51 students, faculty and friars sojourned to the bayous of New Orleans for our spring Mission Trip. They participated in recovery efforts in six different areas of the city, touching the hearts of many with their helping hands. The missionaries' works of charity included serving 3, 4 and 5 year old toddlers at Incarnate Word Head Start; planting gardens for juvenile dropouts at Cafe Hope Life-skills Restaurant; refurbishing a food shelter building and courtyard at St. Mary of the Angels Church in the lower Ninth Ward; distributing energy efficient light bulbs to renovat-

ed homes for Green Light New Orleans; organizing storage rooms and providing office assistance for the NO AIDS Task Force; painting damaged chairs at Rosaryville Retreat Center; and picked up debris, scrubbed floors, cleaned windows and blinds, and landscaping for the Sisters of the Holy Family institutions, primarily at their motherhouse with over 60 nuns, where the average age was 80 years old. The Trip began with a gospel liturgy at Our Lady Star of the Sea Church, followed by a taste of New Orleans po'boy sandwiches, a tour of New Orleans ruins in the Ninth Ward to the grand mansions of the garden district.

Students marveled about the closeness of devastation to the areas of the wealthy. The trip ended with a feast at Loretta's Praline Shop, where Mrs. Loretta served delicious New Orleans cui-







students attended an orientation session about key Franciscan and gospel values as the basis for service. It also stressed the call to be a community of missionaries to those we serve. Students reflected on being like Christ and growing as a community together as they performed works of mercy. Students saw first-hand the courage and conviction necessary to

be successful servant leaders in a new age; proclaiming the Gospel to the marginalized and abandoned of the Big Easy.

The trip would not have been possible without the generosity of others. Campus Ministry received assistance from many to supplement the fees paid by each student. Without benefactors, a Mission Trip would never be a reality for students who have little to no family support. There is always room for benefactors and friends to keep service a priority in the lives of our Quincy University family.

arish Missions are an annual experience here at St. Francis Solanus in Quincy, and this year the experience was excellent. Justin Belitz, O.F.M., came during the Fifth Week of Lent, and gave us a wonderful Mission on meditative prayer. Having been here previously, many of our faithful parishioners had remembered him, and were excited to hear that he was returning. As best we can figure that was at least 14 years ago.

Using PowerPoint during his presentations, Justin showed the basics of meditation, and showed how modern science

and psychology contribute to support the effectiveness of meditation. We had sizeable numbers of people attending the sessions, and many went home with copies of Justin's books and CD's.

One man told me that he came the first evening with his grandsons who are in their teen years. After the first evening the boys asked him, "Are we going back again?" He said, "Yes," and they were delighted. They came together every one of the five evenings, and found it very engaging. They really liked the guided meditation that we did together during each presentation.

I have also received notes, email messages and conversations since the Mission, all telling me that they thought it was terrific, all thanking me for having Fr. Justin come to offer this great help to meditative prayer. In addition to the evening presentations Justin gave a morning session each

weekday and visited with the children in our school. In all it was a very full week. It's a blessing that Justin has such good energy. And of course we all enjoyed having fraternal time together.

Any of our parishes and schools would do well to have Justin come to give a mission or a workshop on meditative prayer. I have to admit that I had expected our young people who are so used to constant stimulation to be turned off by this stuff. But I learned that I was misjudging them. Kudos to Justin Belitz.
